

The Orthodox Church Museum of Finland, RIISA

RIISA is one of Finland's most fascinating specialized museums – a place where history, art, and spirituality meet. The museum's collections tell the story of Finnish Orthodoxy and its rich cultural heritage.

The museum's collections come from icons, church vestments, furnishings, and rare books from Karelian Orthodox parishes and monasteries evacuated during World War II (when Finland lost the area to the Soviet Union). RIISA preserves these treasures, showing how Orthodox traditions have endured through the years and continue to thrive today.

The Orthodox Church Museum of Finland aims to protect, conserve, and promote national Orthodox cultural heritage. It is a specialized museum of outstanding national, regional, and global significance, offering insights into the history of the Finnish Orthodox Church and Orthodox culture.

Your visit can be enhanced with a guided tour, exploring the history and meaning of the icons and objects in more depth. The museum shop offers high-quality souvenirs, printed icons, cards, jewelry, and art books – perfect mementos or gifts.

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VB Photography Center

Located in a charming old wooden house in the heart of Kuopio, this building once housed the studio of photographer Victor Barsokevitsch (1863–1933) and his wife Adèle (1857–1944). This is where hundreds of moments from the lives of Kuopio residents were captured over a century ago.

Founded in 1987, VB Photography Center is Finland's first photography center, where history and contemporary art meet. Throughout the year, the center hosts high-quality Finnish and international photography exhibitions in a historic and inspiring setting.

In the summer, relax with a cup of coffee at the summer café and enjoy the beautiful courtyard. The small museum shop offers products from the exhibitions, including postcards and charming souvenirs. VB Photography Center is a perfect destination for anyone interested in photography, art, history, and stories.

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Old Kuopio Museum

Travel back in time at the Old Kuopio Museum, where eleven charming wooden houses reveal the everyday lives of past generations. Wander through picturesque homes that showcase how people lived in different eras, explore a beautifully preserved old pharmacy, and enjoy fascinating temporary exhibitions. Don't miss the beloved Minna Canth's salon, featuring original furniture and personal items from one of Finland's most influential female authors from the past.

The museum is full of things to see and experience throughout the year. In the summer you can spend time in the yard adorned with lilacs and take part in fascinating events. In the winter you can tune in Christmas and see how it was celebrated in the old days in the traditional Christmas exhibition. A perfect destination for culture lovers and curious travellers alike!

J. V. Snellman home museum

The J. V. Snellman Home Museum offers an intimate look into the life of philosopher, statesman, and key nation-builder J. V. Snellman (1806–1881), who lived in this historic wooden house during his Kuopio years from 1845 to 1849. Within these rooms, Snellman wrote, taught, and developed ideas that would later shape Finnish national identity and language policy. The museum's mid-19th-century interiors, complete with original family furniture and household items, provide an authentic glimpse into his daily life. Visitors can explore his study, the family's living spaces, and objects highlighting both his personal world and lasting contributions to Finnish society.

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Kuopio Museum

– Coexistence of Nature and Human

In Kuopio Museum natural sciences and cultural history come together in a unique way. There are fascinating and current temporary exhibitions, and permanent exhibitions presenting Eastern Finnish nature and the past of Northern Savo. People of all ages can easily explore the exhibitions with functionalities using modern technology. There is also an inspirational playroom for children.

Permanent exhibitions

In addition to temporary exhibitions, there are three permanent exhibitions in the Kuopio Museum. AGE OF HUMAN presents the history of Northern Savo from the Stone Age to today. The cultural and historical exhibition shows the life of local people in different times.

CHANGING NATURE presents the history of Northern Savo nature and looks at its present state. The journey begins far in the past in the mammoth steppe, meanders deep in the natural forests and dives to the depths of lakes.

ON THE BORDER OF REALITY AND FICTION weaves together cultural history and natural sciences by exploring the connection between the annual cycle of nature and the myths and beliefs of folklore.

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THE ART CAVE

- The Life's Work of Pauno Pohjolainen

Step into The Art Cave in Kuopio and experience the life's work of Finnish artist Pauno Pohjolainen, spanning five remarkable decades. This unique exhibition space offers a powerful setting for Pohjolainen's art, where painting meets sculpture, and colour meets form.

Pohjolainen is best known for his large-scale wooden sculptures brought to life with vibrant colour. Over the years, he has received major recognition, including the Ars Fennica Award (1997) – the largest art prize in the Nordic countries – and the Pro Finlandia Medal (2005). In 2025, he was named an Honorary Member of the Finnish Painters' Union.

The exhibition showcases a rich selection of paintings, reliefs, and sculptures from throughout his career. During special presentation events, the artist himself will be present to share stories about his work and creative journey.

Small catering services can be arranged in the exhibition hall for an additional fee. A café and restrooms are located in the nearby Sports Cave. A shop on-site offers books, postcards, and posters about the artist.

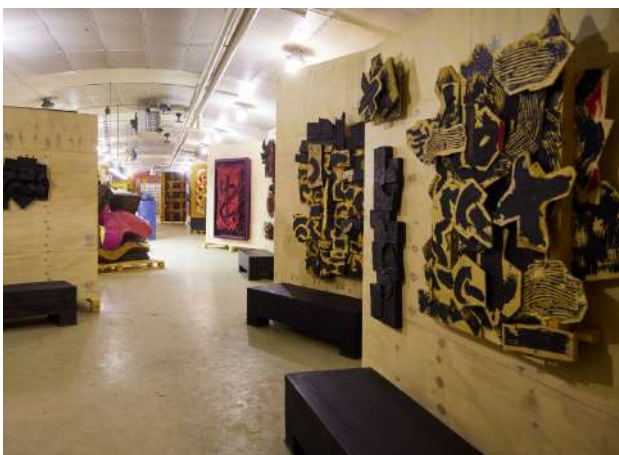

The shop also features elegant watches and timeless design gifts, perfect for souvenirs or special presents. Here light dances on glass surfaces, and every reflection tells a story of Finnish craftsmanship. The Lasilinkki Visitor Centre in Kuopio is a place where design, tradition, and northern light come together in a truly unique way.

At the Essis by Lasilinkki showroom, visitors are invited to explore the very best of Finnish glass design. During the guided tour, you'll discover a wide range of interior glass creations – from glass doors and shower walls to room dividers, tables, and mirrors – as well as Essis' signature pieces: handcrafted artisan glassworks (only creator in the Nordics) and recycled glass designs, made exclusively in Finland and found nowhere else in the Nordic countries.

The designs are inspired by Finnish nature and architecture, blending timeless beauty with contemporary craftsmanship. On the tour, you'll hear stories about the company's long history and its close collaborations with Finnish designers and artists. You'll also get to witness how glass takes shape in the hands of skilled artisans and can create your own style combinations at the moodboard station, where colors and materials come alive.

At the end of your visit, you can browse the shop and outlet, where many of the designs are available for purchase. Light refreshments and additional activities can be arranged upon request, tailored to the group's wishes.

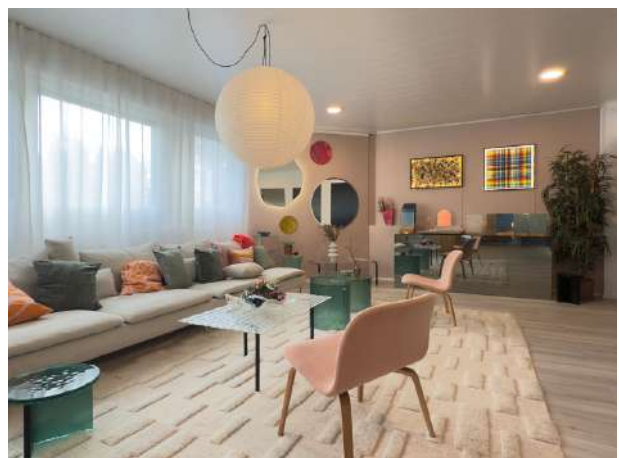

Lignell & Piispanen Distillery Tour – A Feast for the Senses

Founded in 1852, this family-owned company is Finland's second oldest alcohol producer still run by the same family. Here, in the heart of Kuopio, drinks are crafted where northern nature and Finnish design meet – from forest to glass.

On the distillery tour, explore the company's fascinating history, see how the drinks are made, and hear the stories behind each product. During the tasting, sample seasonal or themed drinks, tasting the essence of the forest, berries, and Finnish traditions.

For those wanting a hands-on experience, the Cocktail School lets you learn from the masters: make three different cocktails, discover distilling secrets, and enjoy your creations in a fun, relaxed setting.

Afterwards, enjoy a drink at the Distillery Arctic Bar and shop for distillery products and gifts in the on-site store.

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Jätkänkämppä (lumberjack) Lodge & World's Largest Smoke Sauna

Step back in time at Jätkänkämppä, an authentic 1950s lumberjack lodge lovingly reconstructed from hand-hewn logs. Nestled just on the shore of Lake Kallavesi, this rustic retreat celebrates Finnish forest heritage with photos, tools, and stories from its logging past.

The grounds feature the world's largest smoke sauna, where up to 70 people can relax in its gentle, enveloping heat and cool down with a refreshing dip in the lake or, in winter, an ice-hole swim.

Every Tuesday (and Thursdays in summer), Jätkänkämppä hosts traditional Finnish evenings with a buffet of local dishes, live accordion and violin music, and, in summer, lumberjack shows.

You can join these evenings or book the lodge and sauna privately for events. Don't miss this genuine Finnish experience history, warmth, tradition, and nature in one unforgettable place.

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Minna Canth & Kanttila

Minna Canth (1844–1897) – Finland’s groundbreaking writer, social reformer, and the first woman to publish journalism in Finnish. A fearless advocate for women’s rights, education, and equality, Canth reshaped Finnish society with her plays, short stories, and bold newspaper writings. Her influential home in Kuopio –known as “Minna’s Salon”– was a lively gathering place for artists, thinkers, and political voices of her time. Kanttila house is currently under renovation, but still open to visitors. Minna’s Salon with original furniture can be seen at the Kuopio Old museum.

Today, you can experience this legacy at Kanttila, one of Kuopio’s oldest surviving buildings. Once home to Finland’s first inland bookstore and later to Canth’s family and business, Kanttila remains a treasured cultural landmark. Inside, the atmosphere of 19th-century intellectual life comes alive, offering visitors an intimate glimpse into the world of a woman whose ideas helped pave the way for Finland’s reputation in equality and education.

Discover Minna Canth’s world through a rich selection of guided tours that bring her life, literature, and legacy to life. Whether you choose an immersive general tour or a themed experience – exploring her salon, her path as a writer, her family life, her international connections, or even her fascination with spiritualism and card games – you’ll gain a vivid and inspiring picture of one of Finland’s most influential cultural figures. Each tour offers an engaging blend of storytelling, historical insight, and authentic atmosphere inside the iconic Kanttila house.

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Haminalahti Cultural Route – in the Landscapes of The von Wright Brothers

Discover the beautiful landscape that inspired the famous Finnish von Wright artist brothers in Haminalahti, 15km from Kuopio city centre. Here, calm lake views, green forests and traditional farmland form the same scenery seen in the brothers' renowned 19th-century paintings. The Haminalahti Culture Trail (4.3 km in total, with a main 3.1 km loop) leads you through these authentic landscapes, with clear signposts that tell the story of the artists, their lives and the places they painted. Along the way, you can enjoy views of the historic manor where the brothers once lived.

A highlight of the route is Haminavuori, the viewpoint made famous by Ferdinand von Wright's iconic View from Haminalahti (1853). This landscape, later praised as "a new stanza of the national anthem," also inspired his beloved The Fighting Capercaillies – the most reproduced painting in Finland. The painting is on display at Ateneum, Helsinki.

The trail is partly accessible: the starting point offers parking, an accessible toilet, an information board and an easy first section. The full route includes hills and some stairs. A fireplace along the path invites you to pause, make a campfire and grill sausages – a favourite Finnish outdoor tradition.

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Kuopio Market Square & Market Hall - The Beating Heart of Kuopio

At the heart of Kuopio lies a place locals call “the center of the universe” – Kuopio Market Square. It’s one of Finland’s largest and liveliest market squares, where life moves to the rhythm of friendly chatter and steaming cups of coffee. The air is filled with the scents of kalakukko (traditional fish pie), fresh strawberries, and fried vendace, while Savonian humor flows as freely as the coffee. Even without a shared language, conversations start easily – the Savonian way.

In summer the square buzzes with energy: music, flea markets, and events fill the cultural heart of Kuopio. Locals and visitors mingle, laughter echoes across the square, and sunlight glitters on nearby Lake Kallavesi. Stalls overflow with local produce, flowers, crafts, and seasonal treats – and the cafés invite you to sit back, relax, and “naatitaan” (enjoy the moment).

Market hall

Just beside the square stands the beautiful Kuopio Market Hall, built in 1902 in Art Nouveau style. Step inside and discover regional delicacies, cheeses, berries, handmade gifts, and Finnish design treasures – all crafted with love and pride. Check the opening hours from the website.

Together, the Market Square and Market Hall form the true heart of Northern Savo and Kuopio – where flavors, stories, and smiles come together.

Puijo Peak and Puijo Tower – Nature, Views and Finnish Flavours

Rising high above Kuopio, Puijo Peak is where nature, scenery, and Finnish tradition meet. Just a few minutes from the city center, this green hill offers the perfect escape into nature – whether you want to take a peaceful forest walk, hike through scenic trails, or simply breathe in the fresh Northern Savo air.

At the top stands the famous Puijo Tower, Kuopio's iconic landmark.
